

ON-SITE CAMPING ---INFORMATION

FREE! Camp overnight at Special Operations Equipment.

There are port a pottys, water spigot, and a handwashing station.

You may arrive and set up camp the day before your workshop after 3 pm, or after 3 pm on Friday if you are only attending SRF.

- Please park in the gravel area behind Big Daddy's.
- Prepare to be completely self-sufficient!
- Tent camping is allowed on-site and is an open field with trees.
- You will have port-a-john access and an outdoor shower.
- There are no picnic tables, chairs, etc.
- One public fire pit is available.
- Bring your own cooking method, camp chairs, folding table, water transport, etc.
- You will not have power access at the tent site.
- You will be on a homestead with a bunch of other people bring earplugs or other sleep assists.
- Prefer to sleep in your car? Let the parking folks know, and they will direct you to where the other car campers are.
- If you want to bring a camper, there is a \$10 charge to park it at Big Daddy's.

FAQS

Where do I park?

- All participant parking is at Big Daddy convenience store.
- Place your parking pass on the dashboard. It's good Saturday and Sunday and take valuables with you.
- Can I park my RV onsite?
 - No. Please see "Lodging Information" for a list of campgrounds in the area.
- Can I bring my dog?
 - No. The Willises have dogs trained to defend against other dogs and cannot ensure the safety of your canines.
 - Certified service dogs only are allowed but respect the Willises wishes and do not bring them close to the area where the defense dogs are kept.
- Can I bring my kids?
 - There is no discount for youngsters but ther is a family pass.
 - Children who behave as adults are welcome. If children become unruly – or if adults act like unruly children – they will be ejected from the event.

Necessities & Luxuries

- This is Self Reliance Festival: when you come, please be equipped to take care of yourself.
- The event is held just outside a small rural town on a gravel parking area. It's a trek to the store.
- We have chairs but please bring your own chair if you can, water bottles, clothing for Tennessee and the season, and all the things you need for comfort.
- Cellphone service spotty. There is no internet onsite unless you are a vendor.

Bathrooms & Kitchens

- Toilet facilities are outdoors in the form of port-a-johns. Please do not use the factory workers' rest rooms. It will overwhelm the septic system and no one wants to deal with that.
- In order to feed 300 600 people, every attendee must stay out of the kitchen, even those visitors accustomed to using these areas. If you want to cook or chill something, bring a stove and cooler.

WHAT TO BRING

- Chairs, water bottle, snacks, cash for vendors, notebook & writing utensils, etc.
- Prepare for a large swing in weather! Temperatures can vary GREATLY between day and night.
- You will be walking and standing on gravel all day. You may prefer thicker soled shoes to reduce fatigue and sore feet.
- Don't forget sun & bug protection: sunblock, hat, umbrella, etc.
- Cash is king when hitting up our vendors.
- Be open and willing to network with everyone you meet. You never know who you may be able to connect with.
- If you want to keep your water and snacks cool, feel free to bring a small cooler with you.
